Charles Robert Odom, native of Durham, died Friday, 11 August 2023. He was born 23 July 1941 to Ennis Guilford and Effie Cacindy Nash Odom in Durham. His mother died days following his birth. His stepmother was Beulah Emma Hackney Poole Odom. Surviving family members include his wife Carla Lucille Whitehurst Odom, daughters Charlotte Martin Odom Lytle Perrin (David Courtney, Jr.), Catherine Lynne Odom Quick (Kenneth Douglas) and grandsons Robert Alexander Post Lytle, Christian Douglas Quick, Andrew Kenneth Lokie Quick, and cousins.

He was a graduate of Durham High School, Campbell College with a BS in Business Administration, Troy State University with a MBA, the US Army's Command and General Staff College, having subsequently returned to Leavenworth as a guest lecturer, and courses at the US Army Logistics Management College, where he also was assigned as Course Director. He had been assigned to command, staff, and education assignments in the USA and the Republic of Vietnam, Thailand and the Federal Republic of Germany at the United States Headquarters, Europe.

Following military retirement, Odom enjoyed careers at Computer Science Corporation, as Co-Partner of B&O Computers and as a GED instructor. Over his lifetime he was an ordained deacon, church warden, singer, teacher, and lecturer. He was a member of St. Luke's Episcopal Church. LTC Odom had performed in solo, quartet, and in choirs and choral societies in several countries. Honors and awards included the Family of the Year's Family Life Award. He had been invested on the deck of the USS North Carolina as a Knight Chevalier of the Priority of St. Thomas a' Becket of the Sovereign Military Order of the Temple of Jerusalem.

LTC Odom provided community service as a Rotarian, President of the Colonial Heights Club, a Paul Harris Fellow, and as Vice President of Crater Community Hospice. He was a former President of the Fort Rucker School Association, member of the Board of Visitors for Mary Baldwin College, and Class Agent for Campbell University where he later was assigned to the ROTC Detachment and appointed to the Faculty Senate.

He was a 2009 Inaugural Patron of the Hereditary Society Community and named Honorary Member of the Class of 2018. LTC Odom held offices and memberships in about 50 lineage organizations; notably as the former national leader of the National Society Sons and Daughters of the Pilgrims, National Society of Sons and Daughters of Antebellum Planters, Sons and Daughters of the Colonial and Antebellum Bench and Bar, Descendants of Continental Colonial Officers, Descendants of Colonial Mothers, and Hereditary Order of Descendants of the Loyalists and Patriots of the American Revolution. He was a former Treasurer of the National Gavel Society, and member of Founders Fellowship. In North Carolina he had held offices in the General Society of Colonial Wars, and Sons of the Revolution, and membership in Sons and Daughters of the Pilgrims, St. Andrew's Society and Order of Founders and Patriots of America.

At the time of LTC Odom's death, he was serving as Inaugural Aid-de-Camp of the Order of Founders of the Granville District, Deputy Commander of Order of the Vietnam War, Adjunct Director of Swamp Fox Board, and founding member of the Umstead Pines Book Club. A complete biography may be found under his name with the Hereditary Society Community.

#### When the War Was Over

One bright, beautiful shining morning in the year 1865, near the close of that terrible struggle between the North and South, a telegram was received in Eufaula that made very face pale and every heart beat with a fierce throbbing. The telegram stated that General Grierson with five thousand troops was then on his way here to burn our beautiful Bluff City. What a terrible time it was; the daily fear that perhaps before the sun set so many would be homeless.

Then another telegram was received that made the whole town wild with joy for the war was over – that terrible time of heart ache and deaths. But still General Grierson was coming with his army.

A small detachment of men and boys were sent out to meet him with the white flag waving in the breeze. Several days afterwards while the birds sang merrily in the trees as if in Thanksgiving, the sound of military music was heard approaching the town by way of College Hill. Soon the strains of music grew louder and merrier and the listening people distinguished the notes of "Yankee Doodle" borne to them from over the hill.

Then they saw a beautiful sight about fifty officers (twelve abreast) came slowly down the hills on majestic black steeds, dressed in Union uniforms of blue with the gold buttons and white plumes waving from the velvet hats. How grand they looked to the boys standing on the street corners or sitting on gate posts.

After the officers had past, the band began to play "Dixie." Then came regiment after regiment (four men abreast) marching as if to battle so straight and stern they looked those "Bonnie Boys in Blue." It was a sight never to be forgotten by the people who saw it these handsomely dressed men and sleek horses marching with the setting sun gleaming on their steel epaulets making a halo around them. Four a hour they marched (this line of humility) on across the Chattahoochee to the camping ground that had been chosen for them.

That night almost every man in town went down to this side of the river to watch the multitude on the other side. How beautiful it was, the silvery moon – light making the tents look like dots of white on the bosom of the campground and in this subdued light the hard lines of the scene were made soft and the soft line softer still.

All at once there came to the admiring men and boys on this side the strains of "Home Sweet Home" played more beautifully than they had ever heard it played before. All at once the five thousand men began to sing and the men on this side are with one accord joined in. After the song was ended, the Southern men turned away and thanked God that they could join in a song with their Northern brothers across the river.

### **Membership**

The Membership of the Order shall be limited to men and women who are 18 years of age or older, and are lineal or collateral descendants of those female family members who supported the Confederate Soldiers during the War Between the States. The qualifying female ancestors shall be limited to mothers, sisters, wives, daughters, aunts, sweethearts, and fiancés of qualifying direct or collateral Confederate Soldiers of the applicant.

Only Life Membership shall be offered. A person shall be deemed to be a life member upon approval of his/her application to the Order on its official lineage form and the payment of all fees and dues.

The current Order of the Steel Magnolias application must be completed by all applicants. Names, dates and places of birth, marriage and death must be given in each generation, as far as known, and sufficiently to prove the line. Each generation must be adequately connected to the preceding generation, consistent with standard professional genealogical practices. All sources relied on to prove the lineage must be cited and copies furnished.

Copies Military Service Records of the Confederate Soldier are required to prove service. If an application cannot be accepted, the Life Membership fee shall be refunded, less twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), which shall be retained for examination services.



## **OSM Official Insignia**

The official insignia of the Order was based on an actual magnolia bloom and leaves in Georgia and will be rendered as follows:

#### Top Bar

Top bar is approximately .69 x 1.5". Embellishment includes a top ribbon flanked by magnolia leaves with beaded trim around the remaining three sides. "Order of the Steel Magnolias" appears in green enamel under the ribbon and leaves. There is a hidden ribbon bar on the back to attach the official green and ivory moiré ribbon.

#### Founding Member Pin

The Founding Member pin measures approximately .35 x 1.25" with coordinating beaded trim to match the top bar. "Founding Member" appears in green enamel centered on the pin.

#### Charter Member Pin

The Charter Member pin measures approximately .35 x 1.25" with coordinating beaded trim to match the top bar. "Charter Member" appears in green enamel centered on the pin.

#### Officer Pin

The Officer pin measures approximately .81 x 1.13". The 10 different offices each appear in green enamel in the center of the decorative repousse edge. The years of service will be engraved under the office title.

#### Ancestor Bar

The Ancestor Bar measures approximately .25 x 1.37". The ancestor name will be engraved on the bar.

#### Lower Insignia

The lower insignia consisting of a magnolia bloom and leaves measures approximately 1.13 x 1.5" and will dangle from the official ribbon.

#### Miniature Insignia

The miniature insignia will be a miniature silver magnolia in the appropriate size to wear on the branch bar with the miniature insignia of other societies.

The ribbon of the Order is dark green with a trim of cream.

The miniature insigne of the Order may be worn at any time. If worn together with other miniature insignia, it will be placed in the order of its founding in relation to the founding dates of other societies.

The President's Regalia shall be in sterling silver and will be a single enlarged magnolia bloom and leaves suspended from a bow and embellished with stones.
